**D.) RESOLUTIONS SCHEDULED - PUBLIC PORTION**

**Cncl. Rich DiLucia** made a motion to open the Resolutions Scheduled - Public Portion. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Ronald Garbowski** and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

**W. Larry Cooper, Sr. 373 Blue Bell Road**, referred to Resolutions R:69-2012 through R:78-2012 listed on the agenda for the reduction of performance guaranties for Willow Woods and questioned whether by approving the reductions were we rewarding the developer for failure to complete all the tasks he was supposed to do. He felt there should be no reductions until the job was done. **Engineer Chris Rehmann** explained according to the Municipal Land Use Law developers are permitted to receive a reduction when improvements have been put in and inspected by the township. The pipe work, curbs and sidewalks have been installed and the bonds are being reduced to the point where we can assure the balance of the work will be covered. Certain bonds are not being reduced to the levels the developer requested but he does have a right to some reduction. **Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** added the township has some obligation according to the law to reduce the retainage on these contracts as the work is completed but is still retaining 30% to cover any punch list items that may appear between now and final closure of the project. **Mr. Rehmann** noted there is approximately \$2.5 million remaining in bonds and there is less than \$2.5 million in work yet to be completed. **Mr. Cooper** requested clarification on comments made by **Mr. Rehmann** and **Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** regarding an obligation to reduce the bonds. **Solicitor Fiore** explained the township is compelled by the Municipal Land Use Lawn to consider the developer's reduction request. The township engineer then performs an inspection and makes a recommendation and based upon that recommendation the bonds are reduced to an amount that will cover the cost for the items that are not satisfactorily completed.

With no one else wishing to speak **Cncl. William Sebastian** made a motion to close the Resolutions Scheduled - Public Portion. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Ronald Garbowski** and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

**Cncl. Pres., Frank Caligiuri** questioned whether Director of Public Works, Bob Avis was able to get any information regarding portable rubber speed humps since the last Council Meeting when they were discussed. **Director of Public Works, Bob Avis** noted Engineer Dave

**E.) REPORTS AND OTHER MATTERS**

Cella who was going to research rubber speed humps and to date Mr. Cella has not advised him of his findings. **Engineer Chris Rehm** noted speed humps have become unpopular because of the varied amount of problems they create and there are some questions as to their real effectiveness to stop speeding. He explained portable speed humps can be utilized at different locations and can be taken up so they do not interfere with rescue vehicles or in the winter time with snow plows. He noted he will look into the legal implications for them, as proper signage and pavement markings are needed and put together a cost estimate so Council can make a determination of whether they would be more cost effective. **Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** requested Mr. Rehm to discuss this matter with the Mayor during an Administrative Meeting to see if portable speed humps would be a viable solution.

**F.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION**

**Cncl. Ronald Garbowski** made a motion to open the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Rich DiLucia** and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

**Jackie Fattebin** questioned whether Council was aware of the Fair School Funding Bill introduced into the New Jersey Assembly by State Senator Mike Doherty. This bill would eliminate the Abbott Burke School Funding and if approved school funding would increase for other school districts. Ms. Fattebin submitted a sample resolution showing support for Senator Doherty's bill and requested Council consider adopting it. **Cncl. Walter Bryson** noted there are no Abbotts Districts in Gloucester County and the Supreme Court of New Jersey ruled again this year in favor of the Abbott distribution, which set us back another six years. Ms. Fattebin noted the more people who sign onto this legislation may push legislators to do something because the courts have no right according to the constitution to do what they are doing. **Cncl. Bryson** noted Abbotts is one of the primary reasons real estate taxes have increased over the last twenty years. **Cncl. Rich DiLucia** noted the governor's issue is that teachers are the reason districts are underperforming and that has never been proven to be fact. It is a proven fact, that the money we pour into these districts has not increased test scores and that those districts have continuously declined. The answer is not lavishing them with money; the answer is a better approach to education and Abbotts must be stopped because it is a waste of taxpayer's money. Ms. Fattebin noted as a former educator she can say there must be some sort of discipline, as teachers cannot teach in classrooms where kids are climbing the walls but schools do not want to throw kids out because they lose money. **Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** extended appreciation to Ms. Fattebin for bringing this to the attention of Council.

**Patricia Covington**, approached Council on behalf of a number of residents from the Glen Eyre Development regarding an ongoing problem in the neighborhood. She spoke of sending a letter to Council approximately three weeks ago and of contacting the Mayor and the Police Department because Glen Eyre residents are at their wits end due to vandalism occurring at their homes, which backup to the township owned retention basin and the Mimosa Ridge Development. She explained beginning in January until as late as last Monday the residents have had stones, rocks and boulders thrown through their back windows. All issues have been reported to the Police Department and since the letter was written to Council one neighbor has been hit on two occasions. She noted she was not sure what type of priority the Police Department is giving this matter but it is still continuing. She spoke of how a rock the size of a baseball came flying through her window while she was watching TV with her children and how someone would have been seriously injured from the glass if they had been sitting in the chair near that window. She spoke of her eleven year old child now being afraid when night comes and how at times she has delayed her own arrival at home because of the anxiety this has caused. Ms. Covington noted this is a serious matter and she hoped officials would take it that way. She noted rocks thrown at her neighbor's home had small cherry bombs attached to them. The neighbors are all on edge because they fear for their safety, as they no longer have peace of mind and no longer feel they live in a secure community. The residents do not bother anyone and are concerned that the police have not interviewed or talked to anyone from the neighborhood behind them. She questioned what type of priority this matter has been given, as she understands there are other more serious things going on in Williamstown but something

needs to be done before a rock with a cherry bomb attached or some other incendiary device is thrown through someone's window and their house catches on fire. Mrs. Covington noted to live under these circumstances is really uncomfortable and the residents do not know what else to do. **Mayor Gabbianelli** noted as soon as he received the phone call he called the Police Department for Detective Wolfe to call Ms. Covington. Mrs. Covington noted when she wrote the Council she received a response the next day and she appreciates the acknowledgement she has received. The Mayor noted he just spoke to the Police Chief about this and explained they have very limited information but he will ask the Chief to do some type of legal covert operation in that development. Mrs. Covington noted she installed a camera system in her backyard, keeps her high beam lights on all night long just to try to live here and knows the Mayor and Council can do nothing individually; she just wants them to put themselves in her position.

**Paul Pollastrelli**, a neighbor of Ms. Covington, noted on New Year's Day when he had visitors at his home they heard two explosions and after canvassing his yard found many stones and boulders that had been attached to fireworks, which exploded on his roof. He added this scared the day lights out of everyone because at first they thought someone had shot at the house. Twenty to twenty-five stones have been thrown at his home, which backs up to Mimosa Ridge so he went to that neighborhood and talked to the neighbors who said kids are throwing stones at their homes too and have damaged the siding. He noted he now has an idea of who could be doing this and contacted the Detective Bureau about it but did not get a call back for two weeks, which was very disappointing. **Mr. Pollastrelli** noted the homes in Glen Eyre have very large windows in the back and someone could really get hurt. He also expressed concern that if residents catch the people doing this they may get hurt and if he catches them he may get arrested. **Mr. Pollastrelli** noted this is not a bunch of fluff, it is the truth of what is going on and he hopes, as large as Monroe is, that someone would try to show a little power and let these people know this vandalism is being noticed. **Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** assured **Mr. Pollastrelli** that no one on the podium feels that this matter is fluff

**James Powick**, was in attendance to speak on behalf of his son who had a window broken but was unable to attend the meeting this evening. **Mr. Powick** questioned whether the Police Chief could meet with the residents involved to address their questions and concerns. **Mayor Gabbianelli** explained the township has a monthly Town Watch Meeting where a lieutenant or captain of the Police Department meets with residents to discuss issues and during those meetings they meet on a one on one basis with residents to address their concerns. The Mayor noted he would also discuss this problem with the Chief tomorrow.

**Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** noted this is a very serious problem and pretty creative vandalism that he would never expect to occur anywhere, let alone here. **Cncl. Daniel Teefy** noted he was not sure what presence the police have shown in that development but when he has gone by that area he has seen packs of kids around the Mimosa Ridge area. He suggested the police patrol the area and stop and talk if they see groups of kids in the area. **Mrs. Covington** felt that would be a great idea. She expressed concern that no one ever stops and questions the kids because, as an ex-law enforcement officer, she knows there are ways to question people without accusing anyone. She went on to speak of how her home was hit two times in one week, how at that time she didn't know other neighbors were having the same problems and of how when she first moved into the development her car was keyed and she was told that her house was built in their walkway.

**Ola Ajimoko** noted she appreciates the fact that the Mayor and Council are going to look into this and do something about it but her concern is that if nothing is done to them for throwing stones they will be given the chance to keep getting closer to the properties. She noted any efforts to put a strategy in place that will be of assistance will be greatly appreciated.

**Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri** noted the Mayor is going to take more aggressive action moving forward and try to development a strategy. He urged the residents to keep Council in the loop by providing them with a status report and by sending him emails of anything suspicious so that he can pass the information on to the right people as soon as possible.
