F.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Cncl. William Sebastian made a motion to open the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by Cncl. Ronald Garbowski and unanimously approved by all members of Council. With no one wishing to speak Cncl. Marvin Dilks made a motion to close the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by Cncl. Daniel Teefy and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

At this time Council entered into Closed Executive Session to discuss the Blaze Mill Litigation

Upon reconvening the Regular Council Meeting Solicitor Fiore made the following statement: Council just concluded a Closed Executive Session where the subject matter discussed was the Blaze Mill Settlement Agreement referenced in R:108-2012. Before the Governing Body this evening is Resolution R:109-2012 that deals with that settlement agreement. Before Council would take action on the agreement they discussed changes to the proposed agreement. Those changes are as follows:

Proposed Changes to the Blaze Mill Settlement Agreement

- Included within the body of the settlement agreement will be language indicating that the developer and or plaintiff in the case shall provide right-of-way as required, agreed upon and approved by the State and County with respect to Fries Mill Road and State Route 322.
- Mr. Fiore referred to the actual proposed form of the settlement of litigation and noted for the record Page 4 as well as throughout the entire agreement refers to a proposed ordinance as "Exhibit A". He noted for the record that the proposed ordinance is not in its final format and when it is adopted through the regular course of business the ordinance itself should reference the settlement agreement that is before Council for consideration this evening. The proposed ordinance in its current form refers to the commercial portion of the development as 12 acres when it should actually be 15 acres and in the body under Section III. A (2.) it references minimum lot size as 2,000 feet and that should actually be 2,000 square feet. Council also reserves the right to amend the ordinance as they see fit because there may be other typos or areas that are not very clear and were not picked up this evening.
- Page 5, Section (a.), in the part of sentence that reads "the location of which shall be at the discretion of Blaze Mill" shall be changed to "at the discretion of the **Planning Board**".
- Page 6, Section (c.), and carries to Page 7, refers to a municipal improvement fee of \$25,000.00. The language should be that "the fee will be in addition to the real estate taxes that are currently being paid on the undeveloped land". That undeveloped land is 15 acres.
- Page 8 (ii.) references tot lot. "Tot lot will be deleted". Section (iii.) usable open space "will include the acreage that was to be the tot lot". Mr. Fiore gave the example that if (ii.) was going to be ½ acre for the tot lot and (iii.) was ½ acre for the open space it will now be 1 acre of usable open space.

Mr. Fiore indicated those are the proposed changes that were discussed for the proposed settlement agreement which is up for consideration by the Governing Body this evening.

C.) RESOLUTIONS SCHEDULED (cont'd)

R:109-2012 Resolution Of The Township Council Of The Township Of Monroe Authorizing The Mayor To Execute A Settlement Agreement In The Litigation Captioned "Blaze Mill Development Group, LLC Vs. Monroe Township, Et Al.", Docket No. Glo-L-0000675-09

Cncl. William Sebastian made a motion to approve Resolution R:109-2012 with the revisions as stated. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Daniel Teefy.**

Cncl. Pres., Frank Caligiuri made the following comments for the record. Mr. Paparone, the owner or licensed owner of this property for the purpose of developing the property, has every reasonable right to develop the property as he sees fit within reason. I think that the final settlement agreement for this property is very reasonable, it's actually everything I can expect and more for what could happen to this property if it went through the normal channels. My issue with this agreement is the convoluted way that the developer brought this to market. The project should have gone through the Zoning Board for a use variance and it probably would have been passed by the Zoning Board because it is a reasonable use. Instead the developer brought this to the township as a Builder's Remedy Lawsuit for compliance of COAH and presented a plan to build 600 plus COAH units in a high density area, which is even more high density than the immediate area. Essentially it struck me more as a threat and it also looked to me as if the developer was trying to keep this from the normal board decision process.

C.) RESOLUTIONS SCHEDULED (cont'd)

Cncl. Walter Bryson noted he would like to make some comments in addition to Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri's comments about how this was brought to the township. He noted what he would like to see done at the next Council Meeting is for Council to consider reinstituting our COAH agreement or developing a brand new one, as that would prevent Builder's Remedy Solicitor Fiore noted it is his understanding from the many Lawsuits in the future. conversations he has had with Mary Beth Loneragan that once this goes before the Superior Court for the Fairness Hearing the township will be protected from any further Builder's Remedy Lawsuits. Cncl. Bryson noted he does not want Mary Beth Lonergan to be our COAH Master; he wants this township, the people and this Council to be the master of the COAH in this town. Our COAH agreement was thrown out because we wanted the court to make the decision on how we did our COAH assignments but we have come to the point where we need an agreement regardless of where COAH is right now. We need an agreement, we need to discharge the Master and we need to take our own destiny in our own hands and formulate our own agreement for the State to approve this time instead of one that sits somewhere in limbo. Cncl. Bryson urged Council to consider his request.
