#### F.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION

**Cncl. Walter Bryson** made a motion to open the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Rich DiLucia** and unanimously approved by all members of Council in attendance.

Mary Cote, 1710 Biden Lane questioned if there was a reason our crime log is no longer printed in the newspaper. Mayor Gabbianelli explained the paper solicits that information and decides what they will publish. Director of Public Safety, Jim Smart indicated that information was previously posted on the township website where there is also a link to the Police Department Facebook page. Mr. Smart noted that information is supposed to be periodically updated and he will check to see if that is being done. Mrs. Cote also questioned whether the Library will ever adjust their hours and open earlier even if only for one day a week. Mayor Gabbianelli explained the Library has had those hours for years because they are related to after school activities and he suggested Mrs. Cote speak to the new Library Director about the hours if she would like them changed. Mrs. Cote also questioned whether there were any plans to

improve the Pfeiffer Center. Mayor Gabbianelli noted the best thing to do with that building would be to knock it down and start over but there is no money to do that. Mrs. Cote agreed and questioned whether money was being saved to do that in the future. Mayor Gabbianelli explained what we need to do is pay off our existing bonds and move forward from there. Right now we are just maintaining the Pfeiffer Center but the Library property has seven acreof ground where a new community center could be located in the future. The Mayor spoke o how the Library is discussing creating meeting rooms in the unfinished portion of the building where commercial was previously considered. Mrs. Cote questioned the status of the improvements to the intersection of Route 322 and Fries Mill Road. Engineer Chris Rehmann explained the Fries Mill Road Project has received the planning approval from the Department of Transportation, which means the right and left hand turn lanes have been established. The Mayor and Council got the four property owners to agree to donate the right-of-way necessary for the expansion and that will cut approximately 18 to 24 months off the roadway improvement schedule. The DOT has given the township a two million dollar grant to help construct the roadway and the traffic engineer has agreed to reduce his cost so that the four property owners will only need to pay approximately \$25,000.00 each to complete the construction. Once the property owners agree to that and we respond to a few comments from the DOT and they grant approval we will be able to go out to bid for the project. noted this entire process has been frustrating for the township because Fries Mill Road is a county roadway and Route 322 is a State highway and they are leaving it up to us to get it done. We are very close right now as long as the property owners come up with the funding. If the property owners do not fund the project, then we will need to bond for the money but when those owners come in to develop their corners, they will need to pay their fair share. Rehmann added a meeting was held with the property owners approximately three weeks ago and he expects them to agree to fund the improvements. It will then take approximately four to six months to complete the plans and then we can request help from Senator Madden to push the DOT to approve those plans. Mrs. Cote also questioned what residents need to do to get th passing lane changed to a no passing zone on Route 322 at the Whispering Woods Driv intersection, as there have been 41 accidents there in the last seven years. Mayor Gabbianell. noted that is a State highway and the DOT would need to be contacted to change that. Mr. Rehmann advised he would send a letter to the DOT on behalf of the residents requesting that a traffic inspector be sent out to that location to review the area.

With no one else wishing to speak Cncl. William Sebastian made a motion to close the Public Portion. The motion was seconded by Cncl. Rich DiLucia and unanimously approved by all members of Council in attendance.
