Cncl. Miller reported the County is entering into an agreement with the Pascale Sykes Foundation for a shuttle bus service. The Pascale Sykes Foundation is providing funding in the amount of \$1.2 million dollars for an east/west transportation shuttle bus service for residents in Glassboro, Monroe, Mullica Hill and Swedesboro. This shuttle is the first of its kind providing access to employment opportunities, social service locations and healthcare facilities. The shuttle will begin at Avondale Park and stop at the Geets Diner intersection and the Jefferson Village

Apartments and will run down Route 322 ending up in the Pureland Industrial Complex in Logan Township. Currently New Jersey only provides north/south transportation. This route will provide people with access to social services for job training and also transportation to the Pureland Industrial Complex where there is economic development and jobs. Cncl. Miller noted in his capacity of serving on a non-profit board he has been fortunate enough to work with the Heart of Gloucester County, an organization that helps promote families to self-sufficiency. This service will be a great benefit to Monroe Township residents, as it will help them get the services they need to become self-sufficient. The cost is \$1.00 each way and there has been some discussion that for the first few months there will be no cost to ride the bus.

Cncl. DiLucia reported attending the Open Space Committee Meeting on February 2nd and noted one of the ordinances Council approved this evening was to set aside at least 20% of funds collected for Open Space/Recreation for the purchase of new Open Space. He also reported attending his first Historical Society Meeting on February 5th and noted he was very impressed with the work the committee does to keep the tradition and the history of the town intact. He reported last week along with Cncl. Miller and Cncl. Bryson he attended a very informative seminar in Woolridge that dealt with abandoned and vacant homes that every town in New Jersey is being faced with. Many good ideas were discussed at the seminar and tonight Council passed an ordinance enabling the township to place a financial liability on either the owners or the banks and we hope this will expedite the process of eliminating these vacant/abandoned homes.

Cncl. Bryson noted others that attended the seminar Cncl. DiLucia spoke of on February 15th were Business Administrator Kevin Heydel, Enforcement Officer Dan Kozak and Tara Park from the Construction Office. The work shop was extremely informative as to how other municipalities are dealing with this blight and it also discussed the actions that townships can take to correct and fix seemingly unresolvable problems that affect all property values. Part of that work shop provided tools so that we can make the banks, investors and mortgage companies fix up these home or get out so our neighborhoods can be nice again. Tonight we enacted Ordinance O:13-2015, which Cncl. Bryson called "Lucky 13" because that is the start to give the township enforcement powers. We need to adopt a few more ordinances to put teeth in our efforts to have dilapidated properties put back into saleable condition or we will have the opportunity to cease those properties to rehab and utilized for affordable housing (COAH). The first step is creating an official abandoned properties list and if owners do not respond to the new laws and correct their eyesores they will face speedy consequences. Cncl. Bryson spoke of the violence taking place in the world and of the terrorist threats made on shopping malls and urged everyone to be careful. He also expressed his concerns regarding the relationship between the United States and Russia noting there is no communication between our two countries and that may be bringing us closer to a nuclear war. He added he doesn't know who to write letters to about this but he is concerned that it is getting very, very close.

Mayor Teefy reported he administered the Oath of Office to new officers at Cecil's annual installation of officer's diner and that he met with representatives from Inspira Health Systems who are looking to open urgent care facilities within Gloucester County. He spoke to them about areas in Monroe Township and hopefully within the next few months will hear from them about the sites we asked them to look at. At the February 12th Planning Board Meeting final approval was granted for 112 homes on Malaga and Winslow Road and that project should begin by the end of this year or beginning of next year. On Thursday, February 18th Applebees held a ground breaking ceremony at their new location on the Black Horse Pike in front of Walmart. The new restaurant, which should be open by July will create jobs and give residents another restaurant to patronize. The Mayor noted this was posted to Facebook and it is always interesting to see comments from the public even if they are negative. He reported the township website event calendar has been updated to keep residents informed of what is going on in the township. He reported the Economic Development Committee Meeting held this evening was productive. The Committee is working on the "Buy Monroe" program and will be contacting about fifteen to twenty businesses to see if they agree with the program. The reaction from the Rotary Club is that they do want this program in Monroe and the Committee is trying to get it underway sometime before August. The Mayor reported on March 20th he and Tony Langella, Chairman of the Economic Development Commission will be attending a meeting at the Hotel ML in Mt.

Laurel where thirty mayors will meet with thirty developers. The Mayor noted he is putting pamphlets together to highlight our town and will have a table at this event to meet and show the developers available properties in Monroe. He added he is trying to get a video done from the high school that will sell our town and bring in some other development. Two Main Street Committee meetings have been held this month and on February 17th the Committee went to the Grand Theater to view the inside of the theater. Ernie Carbone has taken over the chairmanship of the committee and is doing a very good job. At the first meeting the fifteen members of the committee were all working together but going into the third meeting everyone has been broken up into four subcommittees that will work on different issues such as the legal aspect of what can be done, what ordinances need to be changed and how to market Main Street. The committee is growing by one or two new members at each meeting and that is a good thing. Mayor Teefy extended his appreciation to Cncl. DiLucia and Cncl. Bryson for attending the vacant properties seminar, as it is sometimes hard for him to get to those meetings. He noted he got some great feedback and information from them and the question now is who is going to handle this and that is what we are trying to put in place. Last week he attended along with Kevin Heydel and Bob Avis a meeting with officials from Franklin Township to discuss shared services as they have the same issues. During the meeting discussion took place about a joint venture to perform the clerical and inspection work and Kevin is working with the Franklin Township BA to address shared services not only for abandoned houses but also for leaf pickup and snow removal. The Mayor noted we have a good relationship with Franklin and an agreement could be worked out where they would plow certain roads in Monroe and we would plow certain ones in Franklin. Currently we are sharing services for tax collection and that is working out very well so we will continue to look at sharing services that benefit both municipalities. The Mayor spoke of his son, Daniel and his girlfriend participating in the DECA Program competition for Williamstown High School and noted out of forty-two teams, they made it to the finals. They are the only two representing South Jersey and if they are in the top three they will be going to Orlando for the National Competition.

Business Administrator, Kevin Heydel noted the way to gain prospective in the jobs employees do, is to sit with them or actually perform their job. Saturday night when it was snowing he went with Bob Avis while he was plowing snow and got a clear prospective of what Public Works employees do. They came in at 4:00 PM on Saturday and did not leave until 5:00 AM on Sunday morning. Mr. Heydel noted he personally met with a couple of the Public Works guys about 2:00 AM. They were tired but continued working. He spoke of how streets are plowed curb to curb and noted it is an art maneuvering those plows around parked cars. Mr. Heydel added from what he saw he is proud of the job the Public Works employees did and noted everyone should know what a great job they did. Mayor Teefy agreed adding he has received kudos that he as the new mayor is making a difference but that is not the case, it is the Public Works guys making the difference, he has nothing to do with it. He urged residents to get their cars off the streets when it snows because that helps to improve how the streets are plowed.

Director of Public Safety, Jim Smart added that the Public Works Department got out and plowed the streets just when the Police Department was beginning to be a little nervous about the condition of the roads so the timing was excellent. He also noted the residents should also be grateful for the coverage from the volunteers of EMS and the fire companies, as they are all dedicated to this community.

Director of Public Works, Bob Avis reminded Mr. Heydel that there is no break peddle on the right side of the truck. He noted he and Mike Calvello monitor the police radio so if they hear a call to a certain location they move their trucks there to insure the roads are clear for the police or ambulance.

Cncl. Pres., Caligiuri noted the Environmental Commission Meetings have been scheduled on the same nights as Council Meetings so he has not been able to attend any of those meetings and since the Mayor already reported on the Planning Board issues he had no reports to give.


G.) ADJOURNMENT
