## **PROCLAMATION**

Cncl. Pres., Miller read a proclamation declaring the month of September as Ovarian Cancer Awareness month.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Cncl. Heffner made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted of the Council Work Session and Regular Council Meeting of August 8, 2016. The motion was seconded by Cncl. Bryson and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

### B.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Cncl. Caligiuri made a motion to open the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by Cncl. Dilks and unanimously approved by all members of Council.

#### B.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Lee McCullough, 432 Prosser Avenue, approached Council to speak about an orgoing issue with his neighbor. Mr. McCullough explained how the issue went to court numerous times, gave some background of what transpired over the years, expressed his concerns that township employees are not doing their job to get the issues resolved and that the good rapport he had with Mr. Fiore has changed because Mr. Fiore in his capacity as Municipal Prosecutor is not always available to speak to him. Solicitor Fiore explained Mr. McCullough stops in his office and comes to court every Tuesday and he is not available to talk to him when his case is not scheduled. Mr. Fiore noted he wanted it clear "for the record" that Judge Curio stated Mr. Vidovic and Mr. McCullough were both totally incredible and since they were neighbors they needed to figure out a way to get along. He added Mr. Vidovic was indicted and a jury trial was held. When the matter went to court Mr. Weikel was not there but Mrs. Flaherty was and when the judge asked her, she said Mr. Vidovic was in compliance. Mr. Fiore added Council is legislative, they do not control the courts or administration and the Zoning Official is aware of this. Mrs. Flaherty noted she issued a summons and is taking Mr. Vidovic back to court. Mr. McCullough questioned whether Judge Lacovara has the authority to impose a \$40,000.00 to \$50,000.00 fine or override Judge Curio's court order. Mr. Fiore advised he can assess the fine upon conviction. Mr. McCullough noted he has gone to Mrs. Flaherty's office numerous times and she never calls him back. Mrs. Flaherty explained she does not have to contact him when she issues a summons, as it is up to her, the prosecutor and the judge to work on it. Mr. McCullough questioned whether this is going back to Judge Curio and if not, what would the fine be. Mr. Fiore advised it was not going back to Judge Curio and the fine could be \$1,000.00 a day but the amount is at the judge's discretion. Mr. McCullough questioned if Judge Lacovara has the authority to override Judge Mr. Fiore noted Mr. McCullough is mixing and matching. He explained Curio's court order. when the township originally filed what is called "The Order to Show Cause" bringing Mr. Vidovic to Superior Court it was pointed out that the Superior Court judge could penalize him up to \$1,000.00 a day per our ordinance. Judge Curio said she was dismissing the case because Mr. Vidovic and Mr. McCullough were both incredible, there was compliance and as neighbors they had to find a way to get along. Mr. McCullough again brought up the issue of the video from WAWA that he spoke of at a previous council meeting. Mr. Fiore stopped him saying that the County prosecutor's office had asked him to review the video with Mr. McCullough and they had done that in his office. Mr. McCullough went on to talk about the video and whether Judge Lacovara had the authority to request the police department to provide the original video. Cncl. Pres., Miller explained Council has no control over this issue. It is a court issue and Mrs. Flaherty has issued a summons to Mr. Vidovic and a court date has been scheduled for September 13th. Cncl. Caligiuri questioned whether this was a civil or criminal case. Mr. Fiore advised right now it is a disorderly person's offence and is in municipal court, as complaints have been signed by the Zoning Official. Mr. McCullough went on to speak about the criminal trial noting the reason they got away with it was because Prosecutor Margaret Cipparrone would not allow into the trial the information from the Grand Jury that would have convicted him. He added he was not even allowed to say anything other than to answer her questions and he was warned eight times that there could be a mistrial. He noted he was not allowed to say that Vidovic threw rocks into his face cutting him and breaking his glasses. Again Cncl. Pres., Miller stated that is a police/court matter that Council has no control over. Mrs. Flaherty advised Mr. Vidovic has been cited, the court date is tomorrow and it will be up to the judge to fine him. Mr. McCullough noted the State Attorney General's Office told him there are 16,000 prison cells in New Jersey, 15,500 are occupied and 500 throughout the state are empty and they are not going to put Vidovic in prison for this When leaving the podium Mr. they are saving those cells for drug dealers and murders. McCullough commented that he would see Mr. Fiore in court tomorrow.

Kelly Hines of the Friends of Victory Lakes Association, a 501C organization, was in attendance to request Council waive construction permit fees for the installation of electric at Magnolia Park located on Magnolia Avenue in Ward 4. She noted the organization is fixing up this property to make it a great place in Williamstown and that the neighborhood won the "Neighborhood of the Year Award" and they hope to win it again next year. Cncl. Pres., Miller advised a resolution waiving the fees will be on the next Council Meeting agenda.

With no one else wishing to speak Cncl. Bryson made a motion to close the Public Portion. The motion was seconded by Cncl. DiLucia and unanimously approved by all members of Council.
