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### RESALE CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY INSPECTIONS CHECKLIST EFFECTIVE 02/01/2023

Below is the full extent of the Resale Certificate of Occupancy Inspection for Monroe Township. It is encouraged that the buyer obtain a private home inspection report prior to purchasing any frome. It is the Homeowners Responsibility to obtain all necessary permits required by Law.

## APPLICATIONS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED 3-4 WEEKS PRIOR TO SETTLEMENT PLEASE SUBMIT THE RE-SALE APPLICATION ALONG WITH \$100 CHECK, MONEY ORDER OR CASH, NO CREDIT CARD. NON-REFUNDABLE

- 1. House Numbers must be 3" min. size on both sides of the mailbox, contrasting in colors.
- 2. Smoke Detectors are required on All Levels, see reverse side for more details.
- 3. Hardwired (electric) smoke detector must remain hardwired, be less than 10 years old and be in good working order. see reverse side for details.
- 4. Carbon Monoxide Detector required outside of sleeping areas. (Exception for houses with all electric and detached garages), see reverse side for more details.
- 5. Fire Extinguisher (2A-108:C) mounted visible exiting the kitchen, see reverse side for more details.
- 6. A satisfactory lab report including Mercury for private wells.
- 7. A Satisfactory Septic certification for all private septic systems by GC Dept of Health.
- 8. Exterior of the property shall be maintained in a clean, safe and satisfactory condition.
- 9. Above & In-ground Pool Barriers must be a minimum of 4 ft. fence with a minimum of 4 ft. gate which must open out, self-close and latch with a release 54" from the ground. Pools shall not be holding stagnant water.
- 10. Hot Tub safety straps must be in good working order.
- 11. All abandoned property registration fees, penalties and all charges related to emergency work completed at the property must be paid in full.
- 12. All construction permits & violations satisfied, and all penalties paid in full.
- 13. All outstanding Board of Health fees must be paid in full and all violations satisfied.
- 14. All Property Maintenance violations satisfied & penalties must be satisfied.

# EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1 2019 ALL BATTERY SMOKE DETECTORS MUST BE 10 YEAR SEALED BATTERY UNITS. NO OTHER DETECTORS OTHER THAN THOSE LISTED BELOW WILL BE APPROVED OR ACCEPTED

- 5:70-4.19 SMOKE ALARMS FOR ONE AND TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS; CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS; AND PORTABLE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS
- (a) In one- and two-family or attached single family dwellings subject to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.3, smoke alarms shall be installed as follows:
- 1. ON EACH LEVEL OF THE PREMISES; AND
- 2. Outside of each separated sleeping area within 10 ft of the door.
- (B) THE SMOKE ALARMS REQUIRED IN (A) ABOVE SHALL BE LOCATED AND MAINTAINED IN ACCORDANCE WITH NFPA 72.
- 1. THE ALARMS SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO BE INTERCONNECTED.
- (c) Ten-year sealed battery-powered single station smoke alarms shall be installed and shall be listed in accordance with ANSI/UL 217. Incorporated Herein by reference. However, A/C-powered single (ir multiple-station smoke alarms installed as part of the original construction or rehabilitation phoject shall not be replaced with battery powered smoke alarms. \*The effective date of this subsection shall be January 1, 2019.\*
- 1. A/C-POWERED SMOKE ALARMS SHALL BE ACCEPTED AS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND LESS THAN TEN YEARS OLD.
- (D) CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS SHALL BE INSTALLED IN ALL DWELLING UNITS IN BUILDINGS IN ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY OR ATTACHED SINGLE FAMILY DWELLINGS, EXCEPT FOR UNITS IN BUILDINGS THAT DO NOT CONTAIN A FUEL-BURNING DEVICE OR HAVE AN ATTACHED GARAGE, AS FOLLOWS:
- 1. SINGLE STATION CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS SHALL BE INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED IN THE IMMEDIATE VICINITY OF THE SLEEPING AREA(S).
- 2. CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS MAYBE BATTERY-OPERATED, HARDWIRED OR OF THE PLUGIN TYPE AND SHALL BE LISTED AND LABELED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND NFPA-720

#### (E) A PORTABLE FIRE EXTINGUISHER SHALL BE INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. The extinguisher shall be within 10 feet of the kitchen and located in the path of egress;
- 2. THE EXTINGUISHER SHALL BE READILY ACCESSIBLE AND NOT OBSTRUCTED FROM VIEW;
- 3. THE EXTINGUISHER SHALL BE MOUNTED USING THE MANUFACTURER'S HANGING BRACKET SO THE OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS ARE CLEARLY VISIBLE.
- 4. THE EXTINGUISHER SHALL BE AN APPROVED LISTED AND LABELED TYPE WITH A MINIMUM RATING OF 2A-108:C AND NO MORE THAN 10 POUNDS;
- 5. THE OWNER'S MANUAL OR WRITTEN OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS SHALL BE PROVIDED DURING THE INSPECTION AND LEFT FOR THE NEW OCCUPANT;
- 6. THE EXTINGUISHER SHALL BE SERVICED AND TAGGED BY A CERTIFIED DIVISION OF FIRE SAFETY CONTRACTOR WITHIN THE PAST 12 MONTHS OR THE SELLER MUST HAVE A RECEIPT FOR A RECENTLY PURCHASED EXTINGUISHER; AND
- 7. THE TOP OF THE EXTINGUISHER SHALL NOT BE MORE THAN FIVE FEET ABOVE THE FLOOR.
