J.) REPORTS AND OTHER MATTERS

He informed everyone that the Police Department is once again participating in No Shave November and Double Down December. K.) GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION (cont'd)

Kathy McCrea, 114 Dorian Drive expressed her concerns with the streets in Sunny Estates not being complete, the consistent rent increases with no explanation, and how the owner of Sunny Estates does not maintain the property.

Mayor Wolfe explained that Council passed the Rent Leveling Ordinance, which is in effect. He advised that beginning January 1st, if there is a rent increase that is over 2%, the Township will impose fines to the landowner, as per the Ordinance. The Mayor stated, the Township will pursue fines in accordance with the Ordinance, if the landowners impose a rent increase of more than 2%.

Pat Gushea, 17 Corona Drive expressed her concerns with how the residents of Sunny Estates are required to mail in their rent payments, the cost of stamps instead of being allowed to pay directly at the office, and the consistent rent increases with no explanation of the increase.

Deborah Ricci, 5 Lydian Drive expressed her concerns with the rent increase she received. **Solicitor Graise** advised the Rent Leveling Board will have to review the rent increases and determine the course of action upon review.

Mary Bentley, 118 Dorian Drive expressed her concerns with the new rent increase that she received, how it was broken down into different segments, and how the landlord does not maintain the property.

William Kerr, 6 Gibson Lane expressed his concerns with how the roads in Sunny Estates took over sixteen (16) years to be completed and the amount of the current rent increase.

With no one else wishing to speak, **Cncl. Garbowski** made a motion to close the General Public Discussion. The motion was seconded by **Cncl. Adams** and unanimously approved by all members of Council in attendance.
