

I hope all is well with you and your family and that you enjoyed your summer. As we enter to the fall season, I would like to remind everyone that our children are back in school, and to please be mindful, some children are walking to and from school. Also, keep in mind the New Jersey Traffic Laws regarding safe passage of school buses.

If you haven't heard already, the construction project of the Williamstown Fire House, located on Main Street, has begun. This project has been a long-anticipated project, years in the making, that never seemed to get pushed over the edge. We are extremely excited that we were able to finally get the project started, but we are even more excited that we were able to cut the project from an initial \$16 million-dollar proposal in 2022 to a \$7.3 million-dollar proposal in 2024, while keeping all of the necessities for our firefighters to serve our community, well into the future. Also, we are very thankful that NJ State Senator Paul Moriarty, NJ State Assemblymen Cody Miller and Dan Hutchinson were able to secure a \$400,000 grant to assist with the funding. I want to personally thank our volunteer firefighters, their building committee, and our Monroe Township Council Members for all their hard work to bring this project to fruition.

Some other exciting news this quarter, Monroe Township was selected by the Gloucester County Chamber of Commerce to host their annual "Best of Gloucester County Awards Ceremony" at our Owens Memorial Park in September. This was a tremendous opportunity for Monroe Township to showcase all that Monroe Township has to offer. This event was very well attended from residents and business owners throughout Gloucester County. We have received many compliments on our park as well as the excellent job our people did in organizing this event.

Also, this quarter we had the honor and privilege of dedicating our Monroe Township Dog Park to our Former Mayor Richard DiLucia, who was instrumental in ensuring the park was constructed to serve our residents who are pet friendly and provide space for them to enjoy recreation. Mayor DiLucia dedicated fourteen years of service to this Township as a Council Member and then Mayor.

We also dedicated the Monroe Township Free Public Library Complex to our Former Mayor Michael F. Gabbianelli, who was instrumental in securing the property and construction of our Library. Mayor Gabbianelli served our community as a police officer, serving and protecting residents for twenty-five years, and then served our residents as Mayor for an additional twelve years. Mayor Gabbianelli has positively contributed to so many things within our Monroe Township Community. Both Mayor DiLucia and Mayor Gabbianelli are sadly missed, but it was such a great honor to dedicated these locations in their names.

Lastly, in our previous newsletter, I unveiled and introduced the beginning of the Mayor's Opioid Task Force. This team consists of Members of our Police Department, members of the Monroe Township Public School District, Religious Leaders, individuals who suffer from addiction, bereaved loved ones, and individuals who want to make our community safer and better for all. Together, this team hosted a touching ceremony, "Healing in Unity", to remember those who lost their lives to addiction and to provide support to loved ones in their healing process. This was a very special and emotional night. As a team, we will continue to provide education, awareness, and resources to members of our community and their families who are impacted from addiction.

I hope you enjoy the cooler weather and the fall season and I look forward to seeing all of you at our annual Fall Festival and Halloween Parade, which is the best in the State of New Jersey!

"TRASH TALK"

Monroe Township Department of Public Works



A trash truck experienced a fire after collecting residential trash. The fire was determined to be caused by a laptop that was improperly disposed of in the blue automated trash containers. Thanks to the quick thinking of our sanitation driver, he was able to avoid any significant damage to the truck and himself.



Improper disposal of electronic devices, especially those containing lithium-ion batteries (laptops), can overheat or get punctured, causing them to ignite. If a laptop or electronic device is thrown into the regular trash, the battery could be damaged when compacted by the trash truck's mechanisms, leading to a fire.



Proper disposal of electronics, especially those with batteries, is important to prevent such incidents. Monroe township offers a recycling program for electronics, where devices can be safely processed and disposed. If you are unsure how to properly dispose of an item, please call the Public Works Department for clarification.


